From Fr Stephen

The term Pentecost comes from the Greek (Pentēkostē) meaning "fiftieth". It refers to the Jewish festival celebrated on the fiftieth day after First Fruits, also known as the "Feast of Weeks" and the "Feast of 50 days" in rabbinic tradition. Within the Christian tradition Pentecost falls on the fiftieth and last day of Easter. In England the feast was commonly called White Sunday (Whitsunday) for the special white garments worn by the newly baptized.

At Pentecost we are reminded that the church is the body of Christ in the world. Pentecost is our traditional yearly lesson instructing us on its identity and purpose, what we proclaim and the source of that proclamation. Pentecost is a time for us to renew our commitment of teaching from generation to generation. It is a time which is infused with energy, vitality and enthusiasm, like a rushing wind. A time at which the Church through the power of the

Holy Spirit receives authority to proclaim the Gospel of the risen Lord. It is a time when we are reminded that God's power was sent to be amongst us and through us can be seen and felt anew and can never be contained.


Fr Stephen will be away until 23 May in Sydney on a Navy course . Fr Robert will be presiding at all services.

Archbishop Jeremy Greaves has embarked on a tour of low-lying Torres Strait Islands to witness the impacts of climate change, with senior Saibai elder and National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Anglican Council executive member Aunty Dr Rose Elu accompanying him as a guide.

Archbishop Jeremy said that the first leg of his visit will involve meeting with locals on low-lying Poruma and Masig.

"I have been anticipating this trip for some time and will be hearing from Torres Strait Islander peoples and seeing the impacts of climate change on their lives and livelihoods," Archbishop Jeremy said.
