Earth Overshoot Day, calculated by the Global Footprint Network marks the date when humanity's annual demand for ecological resources and services exceeds what the planet can regenerate in that same year. This year Australia's date is March 19. It is an annual reminder that humanity is living beyond the Earth's capacity to work regenerate its resources Moving the date:

The goal is to "move the date" of Earth Overshoot Day later in the year, ideally to December 31st, which would mean humanity is living within the Earth's ecological budget.
