God's freely granted forgiveness and love. However, free doesn't mean cheap. God knows the price, hearing the outstretched Jesus' cry out from the cross "My God, my God why have you forsaken me?" In that very instant Jesus felt himself in a distant place far from the love of this Father. But the Father had not left him, the Father was right there suffering with him and taking on the pain, pain caused by a sinful world, a world that had separated itself from God. In spite of suffering, God still offers free Grace, but it will never be cheap.

In 2009 the Diocese of Brisbane passed the 2007 General Synod Protection of the Environment Canon which in its preamble stated, among other things, that: This Church recognizes that climate change is a most serious

threat to the lives of the present and future generations. We have an opportunity to give real effect to our serious concerns about this problem. A federal election will be taking place shortly. While remaining carefully non-partisan, this moment is one when we can make our views and feelings known to decision makers, who are likely to be more sensitive than usual to them .
